The Curate writes..... Dear Friends,

Georgina's departure leaves a big hole to fill, and I have said on many an occasion that I will miss her friendship, support and guidance in the days ahead. It was an honour to be able to speak some words of blessing at her final



service, words that I repeat below. They are words taken from St Paul's letter, written to a fledgling church in Colossae, a relatively small city in what is now southern Turkey, encouraging them and looking forward to their continued journey in faith:

"Georgina you have blessed us all so richly and so often, so we could not let you go from this church, this gathering of people who love you, without asking God to bless you.

We ask God to give you complete knowledge of His will and to continue to give you spiritual wisdom and understanding.

Then the way you live will always continue to honour and please the Lord, and your life will continue to produce every kind of good fruit.

All the while, you will continue to grow as you learn to know God better and better.

We also pray that you will be strengthened with all His glorious power so you will have all the endurance and patience you will ever need for your future journeys.

May you be filled with joy, always thanking the Father, for He has enabled you to share in the inheritance that belongs to His people, who live in the light."

Amen and farewell.

Looking forward to the month of February, it is one in which we enter the season of Lent, and in normal times that means looking forward to some fabulous soup, hospitality, learning and discussion in our Lent groups.

This year is of course different for we are most unlikely to be able to meet in person by then. I have therefore offered to host an on-line Lent Book Club as we did in Advent.

As the year drew to a close Georgina sent us the following message.

Dear Friends

This New Year's Eve I take the opportunity to send a final email to you all and I do so with a heart full of gratitude.

I have been able to thank some of you personally for your many farewell messages, cards and gifts and at St Helen's on Christmas Morning, my last service as Rector of Tarporley, I was able to express something of my thanks for your collective generosity and kindness in your gifts to me.

However circumstances are so extraordinary this year that it has been impossible to see many of you and offer my thanks and farewell personally in the way that I am sure we would all much have preferred. So sadly this email will have to suffice.

I have been humbled by the generosity of your collection, the gifts from our community, flowers, chocolates and of course the wonderful and beautiful Memory Book you all contributed towards and created for me.

As I look through all these messages, memories and photos I am reminded of quite how much we have done together in the last six years and frankly amazed at how much this has meant to you all.

I have often preached on the importance of the 'little things' we do and say the truth that God can and will work through us, and I see this truth now realised in the most wonderful way.

I confess that I did not feel I had made that much of a difference but your words tell me otherwise and I thank and once more honour God for his power and faithfulness.

I said in my sermon at the beginning of Advent that our journeys in faith are akin to piecing together a large jigsaw and that our own character, values, words and actions become part of the pictures or jigsaws that others are building about the meaning and purpose of life, who Jesus is and what that means. During my years in Tarporley Parish, there have been so many occasions when your encouragement or support, your words of wisdom, acts of kindness

or examples of strength and courage have all become part of my jigsaw of faith. Ours has very much been a mutual ministry.

This has been a particularly difficult year and it is clear there are more challenging months ahead, so it is even more important, as we step uncertainly into this New Year, to hold onto the Christmas truth that Christ is Immanuel: God with us; that little things do make a difference; and that the journey of faith is one we make together.

So ask for help if you need it, be the help where you can, and when you can't pray and put your trust in God!

My email and mobile phone number remain the same and I hope we will remain in touch from time to time - but the truth is that as Brothers and Sisters in Christ who have worshipped and journeyed together we share an unbreakable bond.

Although I will no longer be physically in your midst I will continue to hold you all in my prayers and I can do no better now than use the words that Paul wrote to the Ephesian Church.

⁶I pray that from His glorious, unlimited resources He will empower you with inner strength through His Spirit. ¹⁷ Then Christ will make his home in your hearts as you trust in Him. Your roots will grow down into God's love and keep you strong. ¹⁸ And may you have the power to understand, as all God's people should, how wide, how long, how high, and how deep His love is. ¹⁹ May you experience the love of Christ, though it is too great to understand fully. Then you will be made complete with all the fullness of life and power that comes from God. (Ephesians 3:16-19 New Living Translation).




