The Rector Writes:-

It's amazing how much difference one letter makes: it's the difference between sending your Christmas list addressed to Satan instead of Santa, or giving your best wishes to your fiend rather than your friend...One such example that I've been thinking of recently is



'milestone' and 'millstone'. We've got a few milestone birthdays at The Rectory this year, as well as milestone anniversaries in the wider parish: the 175th Anniversary of the opening of Tarporley Primary this month and the 150th Anniversary of the opening of St John and the Holy Cross in Cotebrook in

January. All of these events are good markers on the journey, literally milestones – counting off the distance passed, or the distance still to go. But there are times when celebrating these *milestones* can become like a *millstone* around our necks – the crushing pressure of ensuring everything is right, runs smoothly and is a fitting celebration. The expectation can feel like a weight grinding one down!



Another Tarporley Milestone

The early pages of the Bible also see stones used as markers: when Jacob meets with God in Genesis 28 and Genesis 35, he uses stones to set up a pillar to mark the place where God had confirmed the promise of blessing made to Abraham. These stones designated that as sacred space, holy ground, and Jacob calls it 'Bethel' – the house of God.

To be honest, sometimes I see the buildings that we have in the parish (the three churches and the Done Room) less as sacred space/the houses of God and more like millstones around our necks! When so much time, energy and money is needed to keep them functioning I sometimes wish we worshipped in tents!! But in my less grumpy moments, I can recognise that rather than *millstones*, these buildings are *milestones* for us, marking all that God has been doing in this

place over the years, a very visible and permanent reminder of God's presence in our lives and communities. Just as parties and anniversaries can act as those focused occasions to celebrate big occasions and milestones, our buildings can be milestones too, pointing us back and forwards. Hearing the stories of the faithfulness of those who came before us, basking in the quiet of church and feeling the prayers and worship that have soaked into the stonework, it is hard not to see our buildings as vital way-markers in the journey of so many pilgrims locally: as places where people encountered God, and could echo Jacob's words: 'How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven.'

So as we celebrate over the coming months, may we cast off any sense of them being *millstones*, and embrace the *milestones*, confident that the God who was with us before still journeys with us!

We will be holding an Open Day for the local community on Saturday 12th October from 10am-2pm. Refreshments will be available from the PTA.




