### The Rector Writes:- REST!

The theme for August's Café Church, finishing the seven days of creation, is all focused on the fact that God rested on the seventh day, after all the creative activity that preceded it. This gave the Israelites the rhythm of Sabbath. As we enter a time of holiday and rest, when



students and teachers get a break (and parents and carers perhaps tear their hair out!), it has made me reflect on how well I (and we as a church or society in general) rest. And frankly, I'm not sure I'm great at it! The temptation to look at emails, to do that little admin job or just spend thinking time about work is very strong. I have fallen into the trap of thinking that busyness is good, and every waking hour should be productive. 'Doing nothing' for a week seems like a waste, and so often holidays become just as busy (and tiring) as the work that preceded it: how many of us come back from holiday feeling like we need another just to recover??

So how can we rediscover the gift of rest and Sabbath? What does it really mean—it is about doing nothing??

I think it's more about finding a rhythm, but also one that is sustainable; it's just coming to the middle of the Tour de France as I write this, my favourite annual sporting event, with the riders reaching the mountain stages. And in the mountains, as the riders battle with punishing heat and steep gradients, the best climbers manage to fly away up to the summit; but for the rest, it is about finding the rhythm that is comfortable enough to get to the finish line without ruining their bodies. Not all of us will be able to sustain a pace of life that is akin to sprinting up a peak in the Alps, but perhaps the wisdom lies in finding the correct rhythm that suits us, so that we can finish the race...at least one day of rest in seven, to follow the divine example, seems a good place to start. But maybe also finding Sabbath moments in every day, to pause, tear our focus off ourselves and onto God. If we could do that this summer, maybe our break would be all the more refreshing.

# **Eco Church**

Nick Parker from St Thomas' writes:

July 4<sup>th</sup> is Independence Day in the USA, but here in Eaton it was "runner bean planting day" for pupils at Eaton Primary School. Mrs Skellon and Mrs Brown aided



by volunteers from St Thomas' congregation, led 16 children, each carrying the runner bean that they had planted a few weeks previously, to the Churchyard at St Thomas to plant their bean in already prepared tubs.

There were a variety of sizes and some beans look healthier than others, some are going to need careful nurturing if they are to produce a crop later in the year. All the children now have a bean attached to a named bamboo cane so that when they come back to school following their summer holidays their beans should be ready to harvest, and hopefully, will still be tender enough to eat.

Whilst Nick was helping the children plant their bean lan Freeman was leading the others in an Eco themed quiz which entailed leading them around the churchyard identifying different habitats and observing the different ways we are trying to attract wildlife to our little bit of green space. It was a windy afternoon and evening and some of the beans took a battering but let's see what they produce in September.



In June Mrs Skellon brought Class 3 to St Thomas' to take part in the Churches Count on Nature initiative as part of Great Big Green Week, (7<sup>th</sup> -15<sup>th</sup> June). They spent their time identifying and counting different wildlife and plants. Back at school each pupil represented what they had recorded pictorially with a page of beautifully illustrated and coloured drawings. They also planted two raised beds: one with radishes and herbs and the other with a wildflower mix. The radishes and herbs are doing very well. The wildflowers are starting to show and with an Indian summer may well flower before autumn is upon us.

This is the second year that Eaton Primary School have been involved in the Eco initiatives we are introducing at the Churchyard as we try to do our bit to reverse the decline in flora and fauna in our community. We look



forward to welcoming them back in September and again in 2026.

My thanks Chris Clarey, Jan Freeman, Wendy Parker for helping to walk the children to the Churchyard and back to school and Iohn and Carolyn Earl for managing the traffic on Royal Lane. Thanks also to Mike and Mary Wilson for their help with the June visit.
