The Rector Writes:-

O come, let us sing to the LORD; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation! Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!



Thus starts Psalm 95. Singing has been a large part of my journey of faith; in fact, it is where my journey first began, when I was cajoled to join the church choir aged about 8. From then it was a steep learning curve of chanting psalms, versicles and responses, canticles and anthems. But all of them helped to give an outlet for worshipping the God I was beginning to get to know: fusing language, prayer and music into something that took me beyond myself. It was a way that I could feel drawn into God's presence, and offer something back to God. Music still continues to be a way that brings connection with God for me. For many of us (even those who can't carry a tune) music is a gateway to the divine; St Augustine is often misquoted as saying 'he who sings, prays twice'. Though Augustine never said that, I found recently that he did in another place say 'Singing belongs to one who loves.' This feels very resonant: singing is a response to the love of God that we experience — it is a reason that in the Communion service, having confessed our sins, and heard God's loving forgiveness, we respond in praise by singing of the glory of God. In singing and music we show love to the Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer of all.

This month there are two special chances to be a part of some fabulous music that praises God: the **Vale Royal singers** are coming to entertain us on Saturday 4th October with a selection of music by Sir John Rutter, to celebrate his 80th birthday; and then the **Chester Cathedral Nave Choir** are visiting St Helen's to sing Evensong on Sunday 19th October. Both promise to be times when are spirits can be lifted and our hearts raised in love of God. May that be so for each of us this month whenever (and however) we sing!

Eco Church - Harvest 2025

The Church of England is committed to being a 'net zero' organisation by 2030 - not far off! This means that over the next five years every parish has to take steps to reduce its carbon emissions into the atmosphere to zero overall.



There may be some small residual emissions but so long as those are taken up and stored safely in an equivalent amount the result will be 'net zero'.

In our parish, the PCC has begun to discuss how we can play our part in meeting this target and active steps are already being taken. For example, at St Helen's and St Thomas', all the lighting is now energy efficient LEDs which cut energy use by 90%. St John's has recently won a grant to do likewise. And at St Thomas', the replacement of oil heating by electric heating run off renewables will greatly reduce their carbon footprint. All these steps are in line with the timings set by the Church.

As well as reducing emissions directly in these ways, steps can also be taken to 'offset' some of the carbon we emit by supporting projects which reduce emissions or increase carbon storage elsewhere. A common example of offsetting is by planting trees, which take up carbon as they grow and store it. You may have used offsetting yourself - many airlines for example offer this as an option to offset the carbon emitted during the flight so that your journey can be net zero.

Offsetting can be seen as an 'easy way out', to avoid the hard work of directly reducing emissions. However, as part of a long term programme of work to achieve net zero it can play an important role and will be necessary to deal with residual emissions that are very difficult to reduce otherwise. This is the PCC approach. Projects also need to be carefully considered to make sure that the carbon reductions they offer have been verified.

This year, as a first step, we are planning to use all the donations from **Harvest Festivals on Sunday 5th October** across the parish to contribute to offsetting some of our carbon emissions through supporting the work of Smart Havens Africa and their construction of energy-saving homes. Their operational savings, validated by the EDGE scheme run by the International Finance Corporation, are around about 0.25 tonnes CO2 per home per year.

Climate Stewards, who provide the 360 degree carbon footprint tool we have used to estimate our parish footprint, put a value of £25 per tonne of carbon emitted for organisations wishing to offset through their approved projects. If we take this value, then to offset our total emissions would cost us around £600. Once we know the actual amount we are donating to SHA we can say that we are contributing an amount equivalent to X tonnes of carbon, hopefully our combined total or above. The actual savings in carbon will come through SHA's future the struction at rate around 0.25 tonnes/per home/year.



This allows us to mitigate our carbon emissions until such time as a solution to the main contributor to our carbon footprint (heating at St Helen's) is found. It also helps us to meet our obligations as an Eco Church parish under the 'Community and Global Engagement' heading. It is a creative way to both be thankful this Harvest, and also seek to support our global neighbours, so please pray for SHA and pray about what gift you could give this Harvest to help bless God's world.


