The Rector Writes:-

I've been thinking again about busyness and rest—looking at the diary, even some months in advance, I am seldom faced with many blank days; there are already regular services, planned meetings and the



plethora of children's activities/parties/sports that seem to set a pattern for each day, week and month. And talking to anyone, whether at work or retired, busyness seems to be all pervasive. Being able to prioritise is helpful. At theological college we were encouraged to put the tasks of ministry into a matrix of important/not important, urgent/can wait, to try to see what needed doing immediately, and what can wait. Perhaps we also need to do that with our journey with God? Are there things that are urgent: maybe repentance, or carving out a committed time to pray? And things that aren't as important (learning the names of all of the book of the Bible...)?? What is it that is urgent and important in your spiritual journey?

For some of us, it might be engaging with the Bible more...and if so, there is a great opportunity to do that this autumn as we'll be returning for a second helping of 'Heroes of the Old Testament' in our weekly sermons and Friday Bible studies at The Dray's. Last year, I found the Friday Bible studies a real encouragement, seeing a number of you stepping out of your comfort zone, coming along with questions, comments and a real desire to know more, and then apply it to our lives. I pray that there might be a few others across the parish who might come and give it a go too: you don't have to be an expert or a hero to join in: just a willingness to listen and ask, and a desire to grow in faith. An hour on a Friday with God's Word and God's people might be the most important appointment of your week!

Eco Church - Fairtrade Fortnight 22nd September - 5th October

Nick Parker, from our Eco team, writes: August 2025 saw us complete our first year as a registered Fairtrade Parish when we committed to using Fairtrade products whenever we had that choice. For over a year



now all 3 Churches in our Parish have been consciously making the decision to buy Fairtrade products such as coffee, tea, sugar, snacks where that choice is available. At Eco Church film nights we have been providing Fairtrade wine and snacks for our audience, but there are many other products and gifts available if we look for them.

Fairtrade is about better prices, decent working conditions, local sustainability, and fair terms of trade for farmers and workers around the world, but particularly in lower income countries. By requiring companies to pay sustainable prices (which must never fall lower than the market price), Fairtrade addresses the injustices of conventional trade, which traditionally discriminates against the producers from lowincome countries. It enables them to improve their position and have more control over their lives. This month sees the celebration of Fairtrade fortnight, which runs from 22nd September – 5th October. Over these fourteen days we being asked to **Do it Fair**. With the world in a tailspin, fairness isn't a given. But the power to get there is in our hands. Together, our actions can have a positive impact on real people's lives. Fairer pay. Fairer treatment. Fairer futures. That's Fairtrade. It's not just a label - it's a movement. So, whatever you do, and however you do it: Do it Fair.

BIND Educational Partnership, Uganda

Revd Adam Friend, Vicar of Tarvin, writes about the work of an educational partnership in Uganda: The journey of this partnership began in 2019, with an organised visit to Nyakatukura Primary School. The primary reason to visit was to enhance the relationship between Christchurch Primary School in Ellesmere Port and Nyakatukura Primary School. Within this visit a computer lab was established in the school. During this visit the whole team visited another school, Bufunda Primary School. One of the team promised to partner with this school and soon a staff house accommodating three teachers was built on site, which aided consistency in teaching staff and also enhanced the safety of current and indeed future boarding students.

As time moved on, we looked to increase the schools we worked with including those already in the established partnership in Ibanda called 'BIND'. After a successful trip in 2023 where we were able to establish 4 new school links and continue to work with the others two schools already established within the partnership. All 6 schools now have a laptop, printer, WIFI (and a goat). The first three are to aid the partnership in its ability to communicate. WhatsApp groups have been established and a thirst to share and support each other in an educational way and where possible in infrastructure too.

Within the partnership there are children being supported from individual sponsors who are contributing towards the education of children within the partnership schools. Children are selected from the BIND group following very structured consideration of their background and indeed need. These are currently formalised with individuals and with a single contact in Ibanda where money is sent annually in Ugandan Shillings for the cost of the sponsorship.

The cost of sponsorship is £135 for a primary child, £195 for a kindergarten child and £365 This can fluctuate with exchange rate from Pounds into Ugandan Shillings. The sponsorship is payable before April each year for the start of the 2nd term of the academic year in Uganda. The academic year runs from February to December. There is a possibility of sponsoring children who board and this would be between £300 and £600 depending on the school they attend.

If you are able to help and would like to sponsor a pupil, please contact Revd Jim who can put you in touch with Revd Adam.


The journey continues as we look to expand the schools in the partnership and increase the children we are able to sponsor within these schools.

We are planning a trip in October 2025, where we will continue to make relationships, share educational practice within the partnership schools and to help with the funding of some practical school projects. These are sometimes some basic needs from a toilet block to a kitchen, to a bore hole for water. Beds for boarding children and clothes and sports equipment. When we return in 2025 we are hoping to take come things with us, this includes sports equipment and much more.
