#### The Rector Writes:-

Writing this I am looking out at the rain falling outside, and memories of those sunny June days feel a long time ago! But despite the liquid all around me, I'm feeling pretty dry: dried up of inspiration and original thought. A lot of this comes down to confidence. Confidence in what I



am doing, in who I am, in what I feel I have to offer. As humans we are often drawn to confidence, and people who are confident, rather than those who aren't. Parents and teachers aim to increase the confidence of children, because we know that amazing things are possible when we are confident.

I think self-confidence might be one of society's hidden problems: one of the consistent threads in the 13 years of ordained ministry is realising just how many people I speak to struggle with a lack of self-confidence or low self-esteem, whether in the church, outside of faith, or even fellow clergy. It always amazes me that often the most outwardly competent and self-assured people are the ones crippled by nagging self-doubt.

Yet at the same time there is a vein of triumphalism and supreme selfconfidence that is seen in certain church individuals, more often these days seen in the stark arrogance of comments made on social media, especially when trying to argue that <u>my</u> view is the view of God when talking about same-sex marriage, trans-rights or women in ministry. Over the past year or so, social media has not been great advert for the Church of England in the ways that members have argued on platforms such as Twitter. For me, this overconfidence is rather repulsive.

I recently went on a night's retreat and one of the books I took with me was a collection of poetry by the American poet Denise Levertov, whose work I've been introduced to in recent years. I randomly opened the book onto a poem entitled 'The Tide', and was struck by this stanza:

How confidently the desires of God are spoken of! Perhaps God wants something quite different. Or nothing, nothing at all.

As one who is expected to speak confidently of who God is and what God wants, Levertov's words were a very welcome reminder. Perhaps God's plans aren't the same as mine; perhaps God's priorities are not actually the same as the Church's; perhaps God wants nothing at all. It gives room to pause. The prophet Isaiah reminds us that God's thoughts are not the same as ours:

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.

#### Isaiah 55:8-9

Whilst there is a link between faith and confidence, it may be a good idea to embrace the possibility that we don't always know what God wants. Yes, having faith and confidence in God is a vital part of being a follower or Jesus, but it can be a fine line. To be so confident runs the risk that we tame God, put God in a box so that we can never be surprised by God. As C. S. Lewis memorably puts it in his Narnia series 'Aslan is not a tame lion'; God is not a tame God. If we think we know all about God, it might be time to start from the beginning again...! God's ultimate unknowability is not a reason for doubt, but for confidence, for how could finite minds fully comprehend the infinite?

So this may be why you may notice me pausing a bit longer before speaking (with confidence?!) from the pulpit....! *Perhaps God wants something quite different*...

Dear Friends,

Following on from last month's Café Church which got us thinking about our environmental impact and ways to reduce it, we'd like to keep the conversation going and find out what actions each of us are taking or thinking of taking to minimise our impact on the planet. We want to learn from each other and encourage and support one another on our 'green journey'.

Last year all three Churches in our Parish were able to achieve the Eco Church Bronze Award for the actions we had taken to both reduce our environmental impact and increase the benefits our activities could have on the environment. This year we want to reach for the Silver Award. This will entail investigating what further actions and behaviors we can take under the broad headings of, Buildings, Land, Community, Lifestyles and Worship. We will be asking for more involvement from our congregations and, where possible, try and co-ordinate our activities as a Parish as well as taking decisions for our individual Churches.

Not all the steps we take towards the silver Eco Church award are going to be easy, we are aware that we need to get the balance right between following a greener agenda whilst taking a practical approach. A good example of this would be how we manage our Churchyards.

To this end, look out for a **short lifestyle survey** which will be coming your way soon from the Eco Church team. It will be available as a link in the newsletter or as printed copies in church. It will give us a snapshot across the parish of our collective lifestyles and identify where more support, resources and information are needed to help us make further changes.

Please take time to fill it in and expect to see more from the Eco Church team over the coming year in response as we go for Silver!
