The Rector Writes:-

One of the many phrases loved by my schoolteachers that has lodged in my brain is: Fail to prepare? Prepare to fail! We probably all know that in our chaotic and hectic life, the time for thinking and preparing constantly gets



squashed, replaced instead with the necessity to 'wing it'. But if we want to do something well, we can't rely on winging it all the time: we need proper time to prepare, and this is the same in our spiritual journey as in normal life. How much time do we give in preparation to meet with God? Just as doing warm-ups before exercise are vitally important in getting our bodies ready, how much do we prepare our souls in readiness to encounter God??

One of the ways to do this is to get away from it all, to carve out time away from normal commitments, and set aside time to listen and pray. In Christian parlance, this is called a Retreat, or a Quiet Day. It is a deliberate act and time protected for making a deeper connection with God. They can be a joy (and hard work!), and will often include worship, silence and reflection.

Having just finished Christmas, we will soon turn our attentions to Lent and Easter, and in order to face those times properly, I'm offering an opportunity for you to retreat with a Pre-Lent Quiet day, in the beautiful surroundings of Eaton, on the Friday before Lent starts, with the hope that this will help to prepare us for all that Lent has in store. It's the warm-up before the big marathon of Lent: are you ready to limber up??

Done Room Renovations - Are we nearly there yet??

It's been a long road, but the renovations to the Done Room are nearly finished! Since the builders' vans arrived at the beginning of July, there has been a steady stream of work done on the Done Room: starting with a revamp of the kitchen, and a remodelling of the fire escape to allow access straight from the main hall, and then the addition of a new secure front door.

Meanwhile throughout the summer and autumn the team were very busy taking off roof slates, adding insulation, treating the roof timbers and reinstating the roof slates: each slate was meticulously numbered and returned to exactly the right point, which was quite a time consuming and skilled job! The gable end facing the graveyard was also renovated and repainted, and we are now just waiting for the completion of the front facing gable end and addition of a new drain to complete the project.

Thank you to all those who have continued to donate generously to the project – the grants we received through the hard work of Stephen Wright proved invaluable, but we still need a final push of donations to cover the costs. If you can donate, please scan the QR code below.

Once the final work has been completed, we will have an official grand re-opening, so keep your eyes open for news!

All in all it was a great way to celebrate – grateful thanks to Walter Gibson and Peter Copland, and all the team at St John's who worked so hard to make it a real success!












Friday Bible study

Following the success of the Friday morning sessions at The Dray's on the Heroes of the Old Testament, and our Advent Book Group during the autumn and winter, we have continued to meet to look at The Psalms. Electoral Roll revision

The Electoral Roll of a parish is a list of names and addresses of every person who can vote in the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM). Every 6 years, every Church of England parish has to completely revise its Electoral Roll and start again, and 2025 is one of those years! Everyone currently on the Electoral Roll will be sent a letter and a new form to complete and send back, in order to be added to the new Electoral Roll. To be on the Electoral Roll of a parish, you should be baptised and at least 16 years old. You should either live in the parish or have worshipped at the church regularly for at least six months. Joining the Electoral Roll is a way of confirming that you are a member of our church community. Ideally as a member of our church and on the Electoral Roll you will:

- Worship regularly to learn, pray and praise
- Offer your time and talents to serve, share and give
- Give regularly to the running of the church and give thanks to God for our blessings
- attend our Annual General Meeting (this year on 11th May at 11am at St Helen's) and vote for church representatives for the Parochial Church Council (PCC)

If you've never been on the roll before, please think about joining this year. To be entered on the roll for 2025, please could you return your completed form to the Electoral Roll Officer at 32 Torr Rise, Tarporley, CW6 0UE by **Sunday 20th April 2025**


