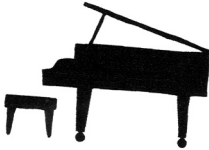

Our Assistant Curate Writes:-

Happy New Year everyone!

In actual fact, with printing deadlines looming, I am writing this letter in the middle of storm Barra. I have been mulling over what to say at the start of a New Year for days now, and today, God has spoken in two very different, but linked, ways to help me put pen to paper.



Firstly, looking out of the window for inspiration and my eyes are drawn to the field of sheep who, seemingly unperturbed by the howling wind, contentedly munch on grass that is becoming less verdant by the day. At the edge of the field, I can see the sandy cliff, fragile and vulnerable to the driving waves beneath and the pouring rain above. Our sea view has improved over the years, as the cliff slides into the sea, and I think it will continue to do so as the planet warms. Further still, the three rugged granite hills known as The Rivals meet the sea where they engage in a never-ending elemental battle. The waves relentlessly pound the rocks, producing a spectacular display of spray and surf, but the rocks refuse to yield.

Secondly, He spoke in the words of Psalm 62, a set reading from today's Morning Prayer, which seem to put into words what I can see of God from my window today. Please take time to read these words, and as you do so, imagine the waves crashing against the rocks, driven on by gale force winds.

Picture the sheep, taking refuge, protected from the gale, resting, eating and patiently waiting for the sun once again to re-emerge from the clouds. Amid the turmoil of a storm, they have found peace and rest.

*Truly my soul finds rest in God;
my salvation comes from him.
Truly he is my rock and my salvation;
he is my fortress; I will never be shaken.*

*How long will you assault me?
Would all of you throw me down—
this leaning wall, this tottering fence?*

*Yes, my soul, find rest in God;
my hope comes from him.
Truly he is my rock and my salvation;
he is my fortress, I will not be shaken.*

*My salvation and my honour depend on God;
he is my mighty rock, my refuge.
Trust in him at all times, you people;
pour out your hearts to him,
for God is our refuge.*

The last two years have been hard in so many ways for so many of us. Next year looks equally uncertain in many respects, for there are so many things that threaten to assault our health and happiness, that might overcome our already weakened fences. You hardly need me to remind you of that! What I hope will help us more is to reflect on the penultimate line of this beautiful Psalm which underscores the reason that we can face the New Year and everything that it brings with hope: -

*Power belongs to you, God,
and with you, Lord, is unfailing love*

My hope and prayer for us all is that our souls will indeed find rest in our Lord God who loves us more than we will ever know, providing a fortress, a rock of salvation that will never be shaken.
