6th Jan: What about the gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh?

The story of the coming of the Magi grew in the telling. By the 6th century they had acquired names: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. By medieval times they were considered to be kings. Whoever they were, we do know from Matthew that they brought three gifts to Jesus.

What about their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh? While we cannot know for sure what was in the minds of first century Magi, one Victorian scholar has offered a possible explanation as to the significance of their gifts. He was the Rev John Henry Hopkins, an American Episcopalian minister, who in 1857 wrote his much-loved Christmas carol, 'We Three Kings of Orient Are'.



Gold, said John Henry Hopkins, was a gift that would have been given to a king. Frankincense had traditionally been brought by priests as they worshipped God in the Temple. Myrrh was a spice that the ancients used in preparing bodies for burial.

If that is true, then you could say that the Wise Men, in choosing their gifts for this infant, honoured Jesus with gold because He was King of the Jews, with frankincense because He was to be worshipped as divine, and with myrrh, because He would also become a sacrifice and die for His people.

The Wise Men were the very first gentiles ever to worship Jesus. What faith they had! They travelled for months over difficult terrain, they never saw any evidence of Jesus' kingship, His divinity or His sacrificial death. They worshipped Him through faith in God's promises about Him. Isaiah foresaw this response to Jesus: 'Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.' The Magi's eyes of faith saw clearly and far into the future.

The Rector Writes:-

I'm not going to talk about resolutions, I resolved as I sat down to write this article; nor new starts or beginnings, or the anticlimax of post-Christmas. Then what else is there to say in January??



Perhaps not much, and perhaps that wouldn't be bad. In one of our Advent book group sessions, we talked at length about silence: both the desire to escape the noise of life, but also the inner silence, the place where we can still our heart and minds, and connect with God. I must admit that between the carols and mince pies, the crackers and roast turkey, the celebration of Christmas is a joyous, but noisy one; did I create room for God to speak and me to listen, or was I too quick to sing instead (with such irony) 'How silently, how silently, the wonderous gift is given'?

Maybe at the start of a new year, instead of the rush to fill each moment with words and noise, we could look no further than cultivating space and silence in which to listen to God regularly. Whether that is going to a special place, or carving out a particular time, or simply turning off the outside noise and the inner monologue for a few moments, to let God have space to talk instead.

You can call it a resolution if you like...but I hope it would become more of a revolution...a changing of priorities where finally I might put God first, and me second. It might take a long time, but we've got all year haven't we?

Eco Church News January 2025: Affordable Housing – in Uganda

As part of our Eco Church journey we are being encouraged to pray for an overseas environmental project. The PCC recently approved a proposal to support Smart Havens Africa, a social enterprise known to one of the Eco Church team. We'd like to introduce them to you.

We often hear about the shortage of affordable housing in the news in this country. And it is a real issue. It is an even bigger problem in Uganda, where many families live in slum houses, paying high rents for inadequate, poorly built homes. A high proportion of these families are headed by women, as much as 30%. They live precarious lives, with little security and unable to offer their families the kind of future they desire.

This is the challenge that the founders of a social enterprise called Smart Havens Africa are tackling. Anne Rweyora, the CEO (pictured with the eco bricks) and Will Broad, the COO, had first-hand

experience of these problems as children and resolved to do something about it. They set up Smart Havens Africa in 2018 to build affordable, eco-friendly homes for women and their families. They offer them a rent-to-own model which means



that within ten years they can own their own home. They use a special compressed soil brick which can be made on site and is much cheaper than conventional bricks, and better for the environment as they do not need firing. They are already having an impact: to quote from their website they have "built 100+ homes, created 1700 jobs, ensured 600 low-income individuals are living in safe, affordable housing communities, saved 3400+ of Africa's rare trees, and transferred \$1.5m worth of assets to women" (https://shafrica.org/our-impact/). Impressive!

They want to help even more women and they face many challenges. It takes a lot of courage and resilience to do what they are doing with a small team and little funding. We can help by praying for them and the PCC also wants to explore how we can support them financially. Over the coming months Revd Jim and the Eco Church team will have more to share about how we are building this new connection with Anne and Will.

Look out for the next **Eco Church Film Night** which will be on **February 28th** – we are planning to show the film **'Six Inches of Soil'** and say more about the work of Smart Havens Africa.

Debbie brings a wealth of experience, warmth, and passion to this role, and I am confident she will make a meaningful difference in supporting our children and families to Flourish. We are so fortunate to have her as part of our Flourish community."

Debbie is already well known to school as all three of her children attended school over the past twelve years, and she comes in to lead Collective Worship fortnightly with Revd Mark Elder from Tarporley Chapel.

Debbie commented: "I am thrilled to have been appointed as the Flourish Children's & Families Worker, I am really looking forward to working with the children of Tarporley CE Primary to



explore and create a new worshipping community".

Although each Flourish project will be unique, there are five core values underpinning them all:

- 1. Young people's voices will instinctively be at the centre of all leadership decision-making and implementation
- 2. There will be a clearly articulated and shared purpose to grow a younger and more diverse community of Christian disciples
- 3. There will be a strategic leadership partnership between school/college and at least one church community
- 4. Each Flourish project will be an intergenerational faith development experience, involving children and their families of all ages
- 5. Flourish will lead worship that is fully integrated into the regular rhythms, practices, structures and resources of the school/college's vision for the flourishing of children and adults

Revd Jim Bridgman from Tarporley Parish said: "We are really looking forward to Debbie joining us on the Flourish journey, and she will be a real asset to us."

Flourish was launched on Dec 20th at school with a special Christmas themed event, full of Lego and songs and refreshments. Further sessions are planned for the New Year when Debbie starts: keep your eyes peeled!
