The Rector Writes:-

One of the resources used by the Church in this time of All Saints is known as the 'Thanksgiving for the Holy Ones of God' – this is a lengthy(!) prayer (known as a litany) used on All Saints day,



which names and collates many important figures in the Bible as well as all the saints remembered by the Church of England during the year, grouping saints together by the similar impact or interests they had. Here is a small part of the prayer:

For Mary the Virgin, the mother of our Lord and God, and all who obey God's call without question:

For Andrew and John and the first disciples, and for all who forsake everything to follow Jesus:

For Julian of Norwich, Bridget of Sweden and Teresa of Avila, and for all who renew our vision of the mystery of God:

For Thomas Cranmer and all who reform the Church of God:

You get the gist! Now I have to confess that this is not a prayer that I have really used in the past, but this year I want to make an effort to use it, because it is a good reminder of all those who have shaped our faith and the living out of our faith over the centuries. There is much to learn from them, in how they lived their lives and much to imitate. And if you research them, they are a collection of very intriguing and interesting Christians!

But one thing that they are NOT is perfect. Although the word now has that connotation, saints aren't perfect people. Saints are women and men who were holy, or set apart (or set themselves apart) by the way they lived and the things they did.

But saints are not just these type of people, the names listed in The Thanksgiving – in fact, all Christians are known as 'saints.' Some of the early Christian writers, like Paul, labelled all believers as 'saints' – this was before anyone went around with a 'St' in front of their name, or any sense of 'canonisation'. Ordinary, regular believers in Jesus were labelled as saints. They would have been just like us – imperfect, problematic, messed up, but trying to follow and believe in Jesus. These were the first kind of people described as 'saints' – not especially holy, not miraculous, not great academics, but ordinary folk, living out what it meant to follow Jesus.

You might not think of yourself as a saint, and there will certainly be times when you don't feel or act like one (!), but **you** are a saint. You are a holy one in God's eyes – set apart to serve God in your life.

The litany ends with these words:

For all those in our own lives who have revealed to us the love of God and shown to us the way of holiness.

There may be people in your life that as you look back were saints – people who revealed God's love to us in the way they lived, their attitudes, their outlook on life, their behaviour and sacrificial or prayerful lifestyle. This season of All Saints to Advent is a time to thank God for them too, as much as the 'famous' saints who have churches or schools named after them or statues put up in their honour. Who has been a saint to us?

We are right to remember the 'famous' saints, for what they taught us, but it is also an opportunity to give thanks for those 'ordinary saints', the ones we lived with. And perhaps to remember that we will also be a saint for those around us, and those we nurture in the faith.



From the Parish Bookshelf

Walter Gibson reviews:- "A Scots Song, A Life of Music", by James MacMillan

Sir James MacMillan is an eminent composer and conductor. He was born and brought up in Ayrshire, part of a devoutly catholic family, and this, together with the amateur music-making in his family and local community, were major influences on him. This book is the story of how he came to be a composer and what he has learnt from that journey about music, religion and life — and their inter-relationships.

As a fellow Scot I will admit to a certain bias here, but I cannot recommend this book too highly. It is only a short book but it is filled with deep



emotional and spiritual insights from a full life well lived. He has known both joy and tragedy, and you can sense his deep faith has sustained him and inspired him musically.

You don't need to know or admire the work of the author as a composer to find it engaging and compelling reading. I'll be honest and say that I am largely unfamiliar with his music, but this book has made me want to explore it.

Much of his work flows from his faith and the liturgy, and he writes beautifully about how the person and life of Christ has inspired music for centuries and continues to do so even in our 'post-religious' age.

His passion for social justice and his local community are infectious and inspiring. His own journey from humble origins began through free music lessons at school and from his family's love of music. Through his words we can begin to how the power of music goes beyond mere enjoyment: it can become a life, a career, it can bring people together, and it can move us emotionally and spiritually.

He also helped me to understand a little more the mysteries of modern music. So, if like me you have sat through a concert wondering what it all means and why it is so discordant, you should read this book. One of many reasons!

Secondly, a request regarding our Parish Finances ---- Anita Langford writes:-

We appreciate that the last few years may have been difficult for everyone on a personal basis due to COVID19 but it has also been difficult for our parish.

During the pandemic, our churches were forced to close for several months and fund raising events had to stop. This means that like personal finances, Churches finances have decreased.

Our regular giving, cash given at services and donations was only £51,000 for the first nine months of this year as opposed to £64,000 for the same period in the pre-pandemic year of 2019.

Our bills for 2021 were £72,000 which was only £4,000 less than in 2019. Like yourselves, we are facing large increases in gas and electricity costs and we need to ensure our Churches are warm, inviting places for you to come to worship or pray.

You may not be aware but we do not receive any funding from Central Government or the Church of England, so your kind donations have to pay for all our running costs for the mission and ministry of the parish, as well as one off items like mending the stained glass at St Helen's.

Therefore, we would like to ask you to kindly review your giving to our parish and, if possible, to increase that giving.

We are very thankful for your continued support over the tough last eighteen months, and thank you especially to those who continued to give via Standing Orders over the pandemic. Without that support, we would not be in the position we are today. But we also believe in a God who gives us all that we need (and more!), and who calls us to use our money in a similarly generous way. Please prayerfully consider if you could increase your giving, or set up a regular payment to the parish.

Also, if you haven't already completed a gift aid form and pay tax, would you please consider gift aiding your donations so that HMRC increase your donation by 25%.
